EVENTS SINCE THE END OF THE YEAR

From 1st April 2016 we relocated our Southampton counselling service and training course delivery to the Voluntary Action Centre in Southampton.

DIRECTORS AND TRUSTEES

The directors of the charitable company (the Charity) are its trustees for the purposes of Charity Law. The trustees and officers serving during the year and since the year end are shown on page 1.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document and constitution

The Charity is controlled by its governing document, amended on 17 December 2013, a deed of trust, and is a company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006, governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association.

Relate South West Hampshire and the Isle of Wight is a Registered Charity and is governed by a Board of Trustees.

Risk Management

An assessment of risk to the organisation is carried out and systems put in place to mitigate our exposure to risk from financial and organisation problems.

We observe the requirements of the PQASSO Quality Assurance and have now progressed to the second level of PQASSO to be fully aligned with new Relate Federation Agreement.

REVIEW OF ACTIVITIES

Management, Staff and Key Management Processes

The leadership roles of The Centre Director and Clinical Supervisors have continued to provide the necessary leadership and clinical direction to ensure that we strive for excellence, fulfil our charitable obligations and maintain a healthy financial position. Our team of over 40 devoted volunteers support our counselling activities and fundraising. We are indebted to them and thank them for the many hours they have contributed over the last year. The hours they have so generously volunteered this year equates to over £16,500 saved.

Mission Statement

To ensure total client satisfaction from initial contact to the completion of a quality counselling, mediation or learning experience.

To be seen as the counselling, mediation and life skills training organisation of choice by those seeking the services that we offer.

The Objectives and Future Direction of Relate South West and the Isle of Wight

By means of our service provision, the objectives of Relate South West Hampshire and the Isle of Wight are as follows:-

to educate the public concerning the benefits of secure couple relationships, marriage and family life in order to improve the emotional, sexual and spiritual well-being of individuals which is derived from committed relationships;

to promote research into all aspects of couple relationships and marriage and to make the results available to the public;

to seek to enhance the good health, both mental and physical of adults and children by increasing public awareness of the benefit of committed couple relationships and marriage;

to promote family life by working to prevent poverty, hardship and distress caused by the breakdown of such relationships

to have a presence in schools and colleges to help young people through difficult relationships

Services

We continue to offer Relationship Counselling, Sex Therapy, Family Counselling, Family Counselling Training Courses and in-house contracts for counselling services. In addition we are now offering a Mediation service. Of the parents we saw this year, throughout our services over 1400 children were involved and have therefore directly benefitted from these interventions. Performance related measurements such as waiting times for first appointments, client's satisfaction and utilisation of our bursary continued to be monitored closely. 93% of clients who gave us feedback indicate that Relate has significantly improved their understanding of their problems which has helped them either to stabilise their current relationship or to move on.

We have continued to use our measuring outcomes system for gathering client feedback. In addition we have introduced the Relate National monitoring tool 'The Difference We Make' and this will be further rolled out across our main services in the year ahead. These tools measure client perception of various areas of their lives at the start and end of counselling and are often used during the counselling journey. They also help to inform our clinical practice and service provision planning.

Results show a significant shift and an improved quality of life for most clients. These methods of monitoring progress enable the counsellor to respond directly to the client need. The Client Feedback Questionnaires are, therefore, important tools in monitoring our activity.

The Co-Parenting Training Courses developed by Relate with CAFCASS have been very successfully delivered throughout our area. Income generated through contracted services, including these courses has, again this year, very much underpinned our financial portfolio. The courses highlight the impact of the importance of separated parents working together to meet the needs of their children.

Relate continues to provide in-house counselling services at Southampton City and Richard Taunton's Sixth Form Colleges. The contracts allow for confidential counselling sessions for students on a self referral basis during college term times.

We also provide family counselling at our Southampton and Winchester Centres and our Trainers provide anti-bullying, peer mentoring and self-esteem courses within local colleges.

Across all our services, we have delivered over 4000 sessions.

Review of Public Benefit

The trustees confirm that they have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the charity's aims and objectives and in planning future activities. The trustees refer to public benefit throughout this report.

Relate studies have shown that for every £1 spent on counselling as much as £11 may be saved from the purse in respect of housing needs, health problems and education.

Practitioners

Counsellors are trained to Relate's high standards and continue to access Continuous Professional Development throughout their careers.

Supervision of counselling at Relate South West Hampshire and the Isle of Wight meets The British Association of Counselling and Psychotherapy requirement of one and a half hours per month per counsellor. In addition counsellors can access group supervision eight times a year. As well as regular supervision at Centre level, all practitioners are supported by the Relate Practice Helpline which is operated by Senior Practice Consultants from Relate National. Relate National continues to research and develop new practice which means that the way we work is monitored and kept up to date.

Membership of the Federation of Relate Centres

We continue our membership of the Federation of Relate Centres.

FINANCE

Investment Policy

Funds that are in excess of immediate operating requirements are maintained in interest bearing accounts with our bankers, as authorised by the trustees. The return on investment this year was £840. No investments in the form of stock, shares, land and buildings are held. If, at some time investments of this nature are made the approval of all trustees will be required.

Financial Report

The Centre year ended with a surplus of £5,019 (2015: surplus £975)

Support from Local Authorities and other funders has enabled us to maintain our bursary support to clients on low incomes.

We uphold the belief that access to counselling should be a right, not a privilege and to that end, we continue to be able to offer a bursary to all our clients in financial difficulty. This is only possible through the support of Local Authorities, Charitable Trust Funds, Sponsors and our own fundraising activities. It is essential to the survival of our Bursary Scheme that Local Authorities in particular, continue to recognise our value and positive social impact within our local communities.

We continue to seek donations from individuals, businesses and organisations. If you feel able to support our work, please contact us direct.

FUNDRAISING

Fundraising continues to be an important income stream for the charity. Raising public awareness of Relate as an organisation, alongside raising funds, is of key importance. Our need to seek support from grant funders increases as the public purse diminishes.

A Gardens Open Day took place in June 2015 in the village of Arreton, Isle of Wight. Proceeds from this event were shared between The Isle of Wight Scouts and Relate. A classical music recital and supper were also held on the Island.

Relate was also present at the Eastleigh Mela Festival and the Hordle Village fete August and September where donations and enquiries were made and received.

A Waitrose supermarket in the area supported us through their green token scheme.

The Waterside Herald Publication have continued to support our cause through their magazine and accepted donations for Relate using a foreign coin collection tower. We are also collecting postage stamps and used ink cartridges as another income source.

The online shopping portal, Easyfundraising, has produced over £200 across the year.

Gift Aid Donations

Gift Aid remains a source of income for us and a number of our supporters and 'Friends of Relate' donate a small sum on a monthly basis. This is an important way of raising funds with the added benefit of being able to claim a sum each year from the Government for those donations coming from tax payers.

Corporate Friends of Relate

Our Corporate Sponsorship Scheme, which started in 2006, has continued through the year and once again we would like to thank our Sponsor, Exxon Mobil for their continued support. This important source of income helps to maintain our bursary scheme.

Balance Sheet

The Balance Sheet indicates that at 31 March 2016 the total funds of Relate South West and the Isle of Wight were £127,504. The General Fund stands at £112,504 with designated reserves of £15,000. There were no restricted funds.

The Statement of Financial Activities shows Total Incoming Resources of £272,190 all of which are Unrestricted Funds.

Reserves Policy

The Reserves stand at £127,504 in line with the recommendation of the Charities Commission. Of this General Reserve we have allocated £10,000 to cover any closure costs that may be incurred.

Going Concern

Our balance sheet remains strong with net current assets of £126,209. The trustees have reviewed the Charity's circumstances and consider that adequate resources continue to be available to fund the Charity's activities for the foreseeable future. The trustees are therefore of the view that the Charity is a going concern.

Trustees Responsibilities

The charity trustees (who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of company law) are responsible for preparing a trustees' annual report and financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

Company law requires the charity trustees to prepare financial statements for each year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charitable company and of the incoming resources and application of resources, including the income and expenditure, of the charity for that period. In preparing financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- observe the methods and principles that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable UK accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in business.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2016 which are set out on pages 8 to 20.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiners

The trustees (who are also the directors of the charity for the purposes of company law) are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. The trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year under section 144(2) of the Charities Act 2011 (the 2011 Act) and that an independent examination is needed. The charity's gross income exceeded £250,000 and I am qualified to undertake the examination by being a qualified member of ICAEW.

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the Charities Act 2011, the Companies ACT 2006 and Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities and preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) (effective 1 January 2015).

The Charity constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS102. Assets and liabilities are initially recorded at historical cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant accounting policy note(s).

The trustees consider there are no material uncertainties about the Charity's ability to continue as a going concern.

FRS102 has been adopted for the first time when preparing these financial statements. The transition date to FRS102 was 1 April 2015 and the last financial statements prepared under the previous financial reporting framework were prepared for the year ended 31 March 2015. The transition has had no affect on the reported financial position or financial performance shown by the financial statements.

Income

Voluntary income including donations, gifts and legacies and grants that provide core funding or are of general nature are recognised where there is entitlement, certainty of receipt and the amount can be measured with sufficient reliability. Such income is deferred when:

the donor specifies that the grant or donation must only be used in future accounting periods;

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 the donor has imposed conditions which must be met before the charity has unconditional entitlement.

Investment income is recognised on a receivable basis.

Income from charitable activities includes income received under contract or where entitlement to grant funding is subject to specific conditions, is recognised as earned (as the related goods and services are provided). Grant income included in this category provides funding to support activities and is recognised where there is entitlement, certainty of receipt and the amount can be measured with sufficient reliability.

Volunteers and donated services.

The value of services provided by volunteers is not incorporated into these financial statements.

Where goods or services are provided to the charity as a donation that would normally be purchased from suppliers, this contribution is included in the financial statements at an estimate based on the value of the contribution to the charity.

Expenditure

Expenditure is recognised when a liability is incurred. Contractual arrangements are recognised as goods or services are supplied.

- Costs of generating funds are those costs incurred in attracting voluntary income.
- Charitable activities include expenditure associated with providing services to the charity's beneficiaries and include both the direct costs and support costs relating to those activities.
- Governance costs include those incurred in the governance of the charity and its assets and are primarily associated with constitutional and statutory requirements.
- Support costs include central functions and have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Irrecoverable VAT

All resources expended include those incurred in the governance of the charity and its assets and are primarily associated with constitutional and statutory requirements.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Computer equipment - 33% on cost

Assets costing more than £250 are capitalised

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax falling under S505 of the Taxes Act 1988 to the costs that these are applied to its charitable activities.

Cash at bank and in hand

Cash at bank and cash in hand includes cash and short term highly liquid investments with a short maturity of three months or less from the date of acquisition or opening of the deposit or similar account.

Creditors and provisions

Creditors and provisions are recognised where the charity has a present obligation resulting from a past event that will probably result in the transfer of funds to a third party and the amount due to settle the obligation can be measured or estimated reliably. Creditors and provisions are normally recognised at their settlement amount after allowing for any trade discounts due.

Financial instruments

The charity only has financial assets and financial liabilities of a kind that qualify as basic financial instruments. Basic financial instruments are initially recognised at transaction value and subsequently measured at their settlement value.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Critical accounting estimates and areas of judgement

In the view of the trustees in applying the accounting policies adopted, no judgements were required that have a significant effect on the amounts recognised in the financial statements nor do any estimates or assumptions made carry a significant risk of material adjustment in the next financial year.
